Awakening to Racism: A Lament for our Time

Bishop Sue Briner

Before the glory of your triune presence, O God, we lament the ways we have fallen short of your will for us. *Silence for reflection.*

We confess to you that we have been blind to the wounds caused by the persistent force of racism in our church and our society. Lead us to see the truth: White Privilege has built a wall around the abundance of creation you meant for us all.

God, have mercy on us.

We confess that we have chosen to remain silent or look away when the anger and hatred of White Supremacy erupts before us and inflicts harm and death on your children of color. Make us feel the pain as if it were our own so that we can truly claim each other as siblings, joined by the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and the grace of the Trinity.

God, have mercy on us.

We confess that we have been comfortable with our predominately white church; that we have become passive in our call to welcome the neighbor; that we have justified our closed doors in ways that mock the Holy Gospel we claim as our core. Open our hearts to the sacred possibilities you offer through your word; that we will come to you only in Spirit and truth, and nothing more.

God, have mercy on us.

We confess that we forget that the place where we gather today is land you created for all your people. Help us to atone for the legacy of greed and violence that destroyed the common good you intended for us in sharing the bounty of the earth.

God, have mercy on us.

We confess that we deny that the prosperity some of us enjoy is the legacy of bondage and torture of black bodies; that we deny our history of slavery, is a sin that taints the very foundation of our country. Humble us to accept that we can love our country and abhor its sins; that we may reconcile the past and be united by the light of your love in the future.

God, have mercy on us.

We confess that, as church, we have rejected the call to be a model of unconditional love, a source of compassion, a place for healing and reconciliation. Instead, we have allowed worldly influences such as politics, materialism, social status, and personal comfort to hold us hostage and keep us from fulfilling our baptismal promises to you. Give us the strength to confront the ways we have strayed and fortitude to rebuild ourselves to reflect your glory.

God, have mercy on us.

We pray that you hear us and wrap us in your healing love as we seek forgiveness for these and other transgression that we have yet to discover.

¹In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, ²the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters. ³Then God said, “Let there be light”; and there was light. ⁴And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light Day, and the darkness God called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

⁶And God said, “Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters.” ⁷So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. ⁸God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

⁹And God said, “Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear.” And it was so. ¹⁰God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together God called Seas. And God saw that it was good. ¹¹Then God said, “Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it.” And it was so. ¹²The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. ¹⁴And God said, “Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, ¹⁵and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth.” And it was so. ¹⁶God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. ¹⁷God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, ¹⁸to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

²⁰And God said, “Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky.” ²¹So God created the great sea monsters and every living

creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. ²²God blessed them, saying, “Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth.” ²³And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

²⁴And God said, “Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind.” And it was so. ²⁵God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.
